Rebates for HVAC tune-ups now available to members

When a licensed HVAC contractor tunes up your system, you'll notice many benefits. Maintenance now means fewer costly repairs in the future, improved air circulation, increased quality of heating and cooling along with what could result in the expanded life of your system. The peace of mind alone that your equipment is running properly is worth a homeowner's time, let alone the possibility of lower utility bills.

Experts recommend having your HVAC serviced every six months.

Eligible rebates for members include terms and conditions. Qualified HVAC systems must be in a home serviced by a local cooperative. The unit must be at least three years old, not currently under a preventative maintenance program and a pre-determined list of services must be performed by a licensed HVAC contractor.

Rebates will be issued on a first-come, first-served basis until your cooperative's dedicated funds have been used. Completed rebate application and documentation must be received within 90 days of service.
